What a trade, exactly the same trade Friday and some real grazing sorts on offer. Miss Erica Simpson of Withiel saw her cull bull realise £1178, with another at £1055.70. In the cows Mr T H Bray from St Columb topped the beef trade with a Belgian Blue OTM at 131ppk and £897.35.

The remainder of the consignment were all dairy bred, topped by Mr R W Davey of Wadebridge at 125ppk and £950. Handy weights of 650-730kg from Treveglos sold from 114-117ppk.

A run of grazing cows from Mr T P W Uglow realised 99ppk for Friesians and 90ppk for Jerseys.

176 STORE CATTLE – RICHARD DENNIS

Put simply, there is no difference from the open market to the TB market for cattle 15 months old plus. Stores topped at £1302 for 2 Aberdeen Angus steers from Mr R W Davey of Wadebridge, others from the same vendor at £1190 and Friesians at £1198. A Swedish Red from Mr R Butter from North Hill realised a massive £1180. A thundering run of 63, mainly Simmentals, from Mr J Drake from Withiel broke the £100 barrier 9 times, in all 20 animals made over £1000 including a bunch of 3 from Helston at £1025 on behalf of Messrs H R Lyne & Son, this group head to Herefordshire.

Younger stores from Treveor Farms, 14-17 month old Belgian Blue steers realised £785 with their Friesians at younger ages hitting £588.
