TRADING STANDARDS DEPARTMENT LIVESTOCK OWNERS – KNOW YOUR LAW
THE WELFARE OF ANIMALS AT MARKETS ORDER 1990

The above order came into force on the 1st March 1991, and introduces new offences which can be committed in relation to the **HANDLING, MOVEMENT** and **PENNING** of **LIVESTOCK**, and may be briefly summarised as follows:-

In a market it will be an offence for ANY PERSON to cause or permit any of the following acts:-

1. Exposing an unfit animal for sale (Article 5)
2. Cause any injury or unnecessary suffering to an animal (Article 6)
3. To handle any animal by dragging it along the ground, or suspending it clear of the ground by the head, neck, ears, horns, legs, feet, tail, fleece / wing (Article 7)
4. To use any excessive force to control an animal by the use of sticks or electric goads (Article 8)
5. To knowingly wantonly annoy or obstruct the movement of an animal being driven or led through any part of a market (Article 9)

Drivers are required to Cleanse & Disinfect their vehicle as soon as practicable and in any case within 24 hours or before it is used for carrying livestock or poultry, whichever is sooner.

FOOD CHAIN INFORMATION DECLARATION

The holding is not under restriction from bovine Tuberculosis (TB).

RESTRICTIONS ON THE SALE OF CALVES

A calf which is less than 7 days old or which has an unhealed navel, or had been to a market more than twice in the previous 28 days will not be permitted to enter a market. The order requires all calves sold to be removed from the market within 4 hours from the time the last calf was sold by auction. In this context a calf means a bovine animal under 12 weeks of age. **NOTE:** This is a précis of the more important points covered under the Order. Further information can be obtained from any Animal Health Officer.
