MARKET REPORT JANUARY 2026

Friday 16th January – Store Stock Market



Store Steers to £2500 – Store Heifers to £2320

Decent numbers forward here at Exeter again on Friday, no doubt partly drawn by the new blistering 2026 trade with another quality entry keenly sought after and every as much wanted as last week. Steers topped out at a massive £2500 given for the better of a fine run of Charolais bullocks (21m) from Paul Pincombe in from Lapford with his next best still reaching £2310. Further top notch Charolais (21m) from John Ridd and Family of Alverdiscott, Barnstaple eased to a creditable £2420 and £2300 followed by a younger (18m) trio of the same stature and breed from Dan and Emma Kirk of Ashwater which saw £2290 a life. Dan and Emma Kirk were straight back in when selling sublime British Blue steers (20m) for £2300 with other Blues worthy of a mention (22m) rising to £2220 and £2190 for Jesse White of Sandford and John Ridd and Family respectively. Also, a lovely pen of seven younger Blue steers (16m) from David Burrough and Family of Chardstock realised £1760 apiece. More tremendous store steers saw Limousins (19m) sell readily and to £2280 for Gordon Elliott of Ashburton and £2200 for a standout one from Anne Quiney and Simon Spears of Moretonhampstead. Best of the rest saw Simmental steers (21m) reach £2180 for Jesse White, British Blondes (22m) make £2100 for Jon Vincent of Staddiscombe, Plymouth whilst young (17m) South Devon steers sold on behalf of John and Andrew Ball of Stoke Gabriel came back at £2050. Plenty of well bred and fed store heifers on offer this week with the very best coming from Sue, Geoff and Sean Cleave of Moretonhampstead who sold well turned out Charolais (25m) to £2320 and £2260 with John Ridd and Family also seeing well kept Charolais females (25m) fetching £2290. Also, much later born Charolais heifers of the highest order (14m) returned an impressive £2110 for Phillip and Tom Cleave of Holne with their best pair. Sue, Geoff and Sean Cleave were back when parting with a delightful Limousin heifer (22m) for £2300 as were Anne Quiney and Simon Spears who saw their pair of eye catching Limousins pick up a deserved £2060 each. Derek Arnold in from Morchard Road brought a couple of his tidy British Blonde heifers (20m) which eased to £2230 and £2200 followed by more smart sorts in the way of five trim South Devon females (24m) from Phillip and Richard Coaker in from Postbridge which drew £1880 a life. Also, a trio of Holstein Friesians (24m) from Evershot Farms of Abbotsbury eased to £1860 apiece and three quarter grown British Blues (21m) ran to £1840 for Allison Clack of Kenn. Several grazing type cows about this week too with those reaching a top of £2280 for Charles Mudge of Tavistock with a South Devon cross followed by Andrew and Jayne Lawrence up from Mullion who sold well farmed British Blue cows to £1990 x3 and Limousin cull bulls (33m) to a notable £2420.

Trade continuing at pace with all types looking very well sold. Greg Hutchings of Launceston presented Limousin cross steers (8m) which topped out at £1560 with other Angus steers to £1280. Brittan & Co of South Brent sold South Devon steers (10m) to £1490 with their second pen to £1390 whilst Melanie Forward of Talaton sold Hereford cross steers (9m) to £1420. Team Abel of Tavistock sold Montbéliarde steers (9m) to £1300 whilst EL Smith & Son of Bridport sold further Hereford cross steers (9m) to £1290. Best of the dairy bred types saw Jasper Love of Closworth presenting Blues (10m) selling well at £1260 with other younger Blues (7m) from H Burrow of Yeoford levelling out at an impressive £1200. CT Squire of Crediton sold Angus steers (7m) to £1240 whilst further dairy bred Blue steers from RN Giles & Son of Plymouth (11m) realised £1040. No real strength within the small show of heifers forward saw Greg Hutchings top out at £1160 for Limousin crosses (11m). Hereford heifers from Melaine Forward achieved £1040 with other Hereford heifers from EL Smith & Sons levelling out at £1000 (10m). South Devon heifers from Brittan & Co also achieved £1000 (8m) whilst the best of the dairy bred Blue heifers from H Burrow (6m) topped out at £980. RN Giles & Son sold similar Blue heifers to £970 with Baulch Partnership of North Tawton sold their Blue heifers (11m) to £960. Baulch Partnership also sold useful pens of Angus heifers (12m) to £950 with others a little younger to £840.

£3000 three times! 43 over £2000!

A tremendous quality entry of 100 Dairy Cows to start our Dairy Sales at Exeter saw a huge crowd of buyers ringside and online to witness a tremendous trade from start to finish and far exceeding all expectations!

A super entry of Fresh milk ahead of the dispersal sold to very strong demand and two outstanding cows from the Chettiscombe herd of Ian, Caroline & Jess Tapp of Tiverton sold to £3,000 twice and £2,700. Fresh Heifers topped at £3,000 for the best of a cracking run of 13 heifers from the Pemberlan herd of Messrs SA & BM Bennett of St Austell who sold others to £2,750, £2,700, £2,600 & £2,500 x 2 to average £2,409 inc one three quartered heifer! Chris Partridge of Broadclyst sold 5 British Friesian heifers to top at £2550 & £2,200 to average £2,100. A consignment of 20 grazing type In Calf heifers from PDM Farming Ltd of Hampshire sold to a top of £1450 with others to £1300.

The dispersal sale of the milking portion of the "Glebewin" herd on behalf of Michael & Caroline Smale of Launceston sold an excellent trade from start to finish topping at 2,600gns for a sweet Red & White heifer "Glebewin Robin Grey VG85" due in July to sexed Troy. Close behind at 2,500gns was "Glebewin Cosmo May" another July calving heifer by Wiltor Cosmo. A September calved heifer "Glebewin Distefano Almira VG85" sold at 2,400gns. Other cows sold to 2,380gns, 2,300gns twice, 2,250gns & 2,200gns three times. In Calf Heifers sold to a cracking trade topping at 2,050gns for "Glebewin Hatchet Violet" due in April to Angus with others to 2,000gns & 1,950gns. The herd including all faulted cows averaged £1978!

30 ORPHAN LAMBS

30 Orphan lambs saw half reared sorts from Tom & Helen Garland of Budleigh Salterton sell in pens at £65, £61 & £41 whilst Charlotte Radley of Tiverton sold the bets of the setting on lambs at £35 and Richard & Angela Smaridge of East Allington claimed 330 of all three of theirs with an overall average of £48.

2844 STORE HOGGS

A much larger entry of 2844 store hoggs weren't the quality or the trade of last week with more bottom end sorts forward and trade generally back £4-£6 on everything resulting in an overall average of £115, which is £17 less than last week but very similar to the average of two weeks ago. Best hoggs to £154 & £145 for SD & HA Hooper of Brentor whilst John Thorn of Buckfastleigh made £150 of his ram hogg and David & Lynda Pellow of Sourton sold their pens of large Suffolk x Mules at £150, £149 & £148. Raymond & Sheila Palmer of Lustleigh reached £148.50 closely followed by Andrew Bond of South Milton at £148 and both Steve Parish of Chawleigh and Steve Bonner of Meshaw reached £147. Forward hoggs generally £130 to £145 with medium term farming hoggs from £120 up and the smaller end usually all £95 and above unless hill bred, backwards or sold with a fault, of which there seemed many today.

GRAZING EWES

Grazers to £168 for John Thorn who sold others at £156 as John Bond of East Allington made £162 and Richard and Angela Smaridge reached £160. Other genuine grazers to £148 for a large pen from Richard & Felicity Luscombe of Shaugh Prior and a lot of sheep sold in the £130's and £140's.

244 BREEDING EWES

244 breeding ewes met a straight but sometimes selective trade with Evershot Farms of Dorchester selling their best two pens of Suffolk x Mules and a pen of coloured Welsh Mules at £280 followed by three pens of NC Mules and a pen of White faced Welsh Mules at £270. Elsewhere Graham Hill of Wiggaton made £205 and Richards Bros of Newquay claimed £185 twice of their best.

61 EWES & 93 LAMBS (154 LIVES)

61 Ewes with 93 lambs at foot met a similar trade on the week with Chris & Sue Popham of Trull topping the section with a pen of 5 FM Dorset Mule doubles at £380, Tracey Stoneman of Chudleigh with her best double at £320 whilst the Burrough family of Axminster sold two lots of doubles at £310 and Brian & Clare Westcott of Exford reached £305 twice. Single also to £265 from Brian and Clare with the overall average back slightly at £261 per outfit and £102 per life.
