### Tuesday 9th April

### South Devon Herd Book Society Spring Show & Sale Report Auctioneer: Mark Davis

In a time of excellent beef prices there was a strong trade for South Devon bulls at Wednesday's (9th April) Spring Show and Sale at Exeter Livestock Centre. This resulted in an increase in the average by £534 on last year's sale, showing a positive trend for the eighth successive year.

Top price of the day at 9000gns was the reserve champion bull from Colcharton Farm Partners, Tavistock, Devon, in the form of Colcharton Clyde 9. A son of the 2019 top priced Trewint Clyde, he caught the eye of many and after some fierce bidding he was secured by M R and R J Rowe, Liskeard, Cornwall for their Tregondale herd. The Tregondale Herd had enjoyed success at the previous evenings AGM and awards by winning the Female of the Year for Tregondale Dewdrop 180. The Rowe Family were clearly taken with Colcharton Clyde 9 with Richard commenting "We wanted a myostatin 0 bull to go with our myostatin I cows this season. He had a very correct tail setting, great top line through the shoulder and a good length. Really he was just our type of bull!" Second best on the day was Boakley Emperor, a previous winner of the yearling bull class at the National Show and the winner of class two of the pre-sale show from R Saunders, Malmesbury, Wiltshire. Securing this one at 8000gns was C E Caunter and Son, Ipplepen, Devon. "Emperor is a lovely stamp of a bull that is everything I would be looking for, so I am excited to see what he produces going forward with Mr Caunter," Reuben explained while reflecting on a very positive sale for the herd.

Three bulls followed closely behind with price tags of 7500gns, the first being Providence Major from S, L and J Tucker, Salcombe, Devon, a Sexton Majestic son. Out of a Mutterton bred female, this one being snapped up by S J and S M Ward, Truro, Cornwall. At the same money was Colcharton Clyde II. By the same sire as the top price bull from Colcharton Farm Partners, he was the pick of G Able and Sons, Tavistock, Devon. This animal will be heading to Dartmoor to put his stamp on a herd of cattle that hosted the Region 2 members last year for an evenings farm walk. A C Luscombe and sons, East Allington, Devon, later won the bidding war to secure Godworthy King 2, a son of Mutterton Kingston Black, from R C Burrough and sons, Axminster, Devon, also at 7500gns.

Champion of the day, Trewint Capri, from father and son team Peter and Ashley Rowe, Liskeard, Cornwall, had the same sire as last year's champion in the form of the renowned Trewint Carlos, the first placed bull in the 2023 National herd competition. Top of the pile to secure this one at 7000gns was D J Thomas and Son, Launceston, Cornwall, for their Treguddick herd. Trewint Capri, 7,000gns

A pair of bulls then capped at 6000gns, the first being another Trewint Carlos son in the form of Trewint Cornelius from previously mentioned vendors Messrs Rowe. A successfully shown yearling bull last year was the pick of C G Bonner and Son, Thornton, Buckinghamshire. The other was Waddeton Illustrious 8 from The Tully Partnership, Brixham, Devon, he finds his new home with R J Rew and Son, Newton Abbot, Devon. D J Thomas and son were able to recoup some of their investment in selling Treguddick Proctar 4 for 5800gns to W P L Cowling and Son, Newquay, Cornwall. Following this one at 5500gns was Godworthy Astar 22 from Messrs Burrough, which was snapped up by W and H M Palmer and Son, Kingsbridge, Devon. Also, at 5500gns was Mutterton Harry Masters 4 from a prolific bull producing dam line, he heads North with Walton, Leicestershire-based G P Hubbard and Son.

The Tully Partnership were back in the limelight again with Waddeton Euclad I, after winning class five at the pre-sale show, he sold to J A Perry and Sons, Lawhitton, Cornwall, capping off a successful sale with a good solid trade throughout for the better bulls.

Only two cows forward in the female section but they were well sold and sought after with a sale top price of 3500gns for the March 2017-born cow, Woodhayes Daffodil 65 from B G and J Z A Dart, Cullompton, Devon. This one is by Hawkley SAS Javelin and out of a home bred female by Edmeston Homer 1. Sold in calf to Rufford SAS Dillon, this one found a new home with Mr A Rew of Newton Abbot, Devon.

### 852 Store Cattle and Stirks Store Steers to £2800 Store Heifers to £2280

A super yarding of some 700 head of store cattle here at Exeter this week and some tremendous, high quality steers and heifers on offer selling in front of a host of buyers and to an outstanding trade once again, right across the board. Many purchasers drawn this week not only by high numbers forward, but also by our third spring show and sale of continental bred stores which always produces some high class entries. Friday saw steers rise to a top of £2800 given for a monstrous South Devon (22m) from Dan Tooze up from Broadsands with others of a similar age reaching £2490 for Martin and David Sampson of Chudleigh and an eye yearling South Devon from John and Steph Rogers of Yealmpton rose to £2080. Best of the Aberdeen Angus bullocks (24m) also came from Dan Tooze and sold for £2600 followed by Clyst Honiton's Derek Pyle with more Angus bullocks of the same age at £2580 with further native breed steers picking up £2600 and £2500 for big bunches of Herefords (25m) sold on behalf of Roy Kneebone of Lifton. Limousin steers (30m) up next when drawing £2590 for Derek Pyle with others, only younger (23m) still realising £2500 for a cracker from Andrew Cleave of Christow. Much later born yearling Limousin steers of high order ran to £2120 for Anne Quiney and Simon Spears in from Moretonhampstead. Plenty of those decently bred and fed Charolais bullocks forward again this Friday with the very best (22m) coming back at £2500 for the Keast Family of North Tawton followed by more tidy sorts (18m) fetching £2450 for John Cole and Family of lyybridge who also sold nice yearling Charolais bullock for a creditable £2000. As ever, a flood of British Blue stores about again this week with steers (27m) selling to £2380 for Phillip Slade and Family from Calverleigh followed by others (30m) at £2380 for Derek Pyle whilst younger (18m) Blues still saw £2340 for Matthew and Kelly Reeve up from Halwell. Dan Tooze back when parting with a couple of Devon crossbred steers (22m) for a decent enough £2350. Other store steer prices of note included Salers (18m) from John Cole and Family at £2300, a trio of Simmental's (26m) also drawing £2300 for Gordon White and Family together with strong British Blonde steers (22m) making £2240 for Andrew Down of Barnstaple and pen of smart Beef Shorthorn's (24m) at £2240 for Roger Grose up from Gorren. Onto the store heifers with several ringing the £2000 bell once more and topping out at £2280 for magnificent young (13m) South Devon for Rundle Weldhen of Newquay with older South Devon's (24m) from Steve Cane up from Spriddlestone, Plymouth coming back at £2220 and a pen of five (22m) returning £2120 apiece for Phillip and Richie Coaker of Postbridge. More super Beef Shorthorn's from Roger Grose saw his tremendous heifers (24m) hit £2240 whilst British Blue females (27m) eased to £2240 for Hubert Chugg of Stockleigh Pomeroy and £2180 (20m) for Dan and Emma Kirk up from Ashwater and £2080 for Alan Hembrow and Family from Lostwithiel. Andrew Down parted with the better of his British Blonde heifers (22m) for £2220 followed by top Charolais of the day at £2200 (17m) for Peter Hendy of Plymouth and £2120 (20m) for Alan Hembrow and Family. Limousin heifers (28m) from Gordon White and Family easily came back at £2180 whilst forward Hereford's (22m) reached £2000 for Steve Cane and young, yearling Hereford females shot to £1600 for Rundle Weldhen. Aberdeen Angus heifers (26m) of good quality racked up £1980 for Matthew and Kelly Reeve of Halwell, whilst Simmental's (only 15m) saw £1910 for Ayres and Nichols of Umberleigh. Also, a pair of stout Galloway bred heifers from Mary and Dan Alford, Tavistock rose to £1800 a life. Several grazing cows about this Friday when we saw Simmentals sell to £2090 and £2040 for Steven Rendle of Plymouth and Alison Collins of Diptford whilst Roger Grose sold a solid looking Beef Shorthorn cow for £2040. South Devon grazers rose to £1990 for Phillip and Richie Coaker and a Stabiliser drew £1880 for Mike Ruell of Wiveliscombe. Also, Limousin barreners saw £1700 for Gordon White and Family of Coleford and the better of a large run of British Blue's from Andrew and Jayne Lawrence up from Mullion ran to £1560.

### \*\*\* 104 milkers average £2228! \*\*\*

A massive entry of 228 dairy cattle sold at Exeter Livestock Centre with vendors selling from as far as West Sussex, Kent, Hertfordshire, Peterborough, Hampshire and across the South West. A strong crowd of buyers from as far as Scotland, Cumbria, Wales, Shropshire & across the Westcountry packed the ringside to see the trade absolutely off the clock when all breeds of milkers were in serious demand!

There is no doubt that we had a huge choice with just about every breed represented. A consignment of 32 Friesian grazing type heifers sold on behalf of Messrs RH Waterworth Ltd of Peterborough, these heifers set the ring alight and sold to a top call of £3,000 three times with 17 other heifers making between £2,900 & £2,950 with a staggering overall average of £2,668! Other grand fresh heifers sold to £2,950 & £2,900 Messrs Blackmore & Son from their Firwalk herd in Honiton and £2,900 twice for David Renfree & Family of Liskeard from their Hayvalley Herd. Messrs SJ Hockridge & Son of Bideford sold two Holstein cows to £2750 & £2700 and two pedigree Brown Swiss cows to £2100 apiece. Messrs CDG & EM Gooding & Son sold their first consignment of British Friesian cows to disperse their herd and topped at £2,700 with others to £2,600 & £2,400. Nick & Shane Willis of Kennford sold a British Friesian heifers at £2,450 and a sixth calving cow at £1650. Messrs Nicholls sold 6 pedigree Ayrshire cows & heifers to top at £2,200 with others to £2,000 to average £1983. Messrs MA & PJ Blanch of West Sussex sold a consignment of 26 Autumn calving Jersey, Guernsey and Crossbred cows & heifers to an immense trade topping at 2,750gns with others to 2,550gns twice, 2,300gns & 2,100gns twice to average a phenomenal £1968!

Youngstock saw British Friesian in calf heifers top at 1,680gns, 1,480gns & 1,300gns for Messrs CDG & EM Gooding & Son who also sold bulling heifers to 1120gns & 1000gns. Other bulling heifers saw Ayrshires to 850gns & 800gns for Messrs MS & N Hebditch of Chard. The Gold Top Sale of 95 pedigree Jerseys sold to a flying trade, the fresh milk sold exceptionally well topping at 2,300gns for Oliver Neagle of Winchester from his Hiltonbury herd who sold others to 2,300gns, 1,950gns & 1,900gns to average £1884 of his consignment of 11. Barry & Jenny Daw sold a consignment of 4 fresh heifers from their Bluegrass Herd which topped at 2,000gns three times with Claire Daw selling a heifer from her Bluerock herd at 1,800gns. Their consignment averaged £2076. A consignment of 32 pedigree Jersey Autumn calving in calf heifers from James & Louisa Edgar's Brastead herd in Kent were undoubtedly the trade of the day seeing fierce competition with 12 over £2,000 topping at 2,300gns with others to 2,220gns x 3 & 2,150gns x3, this consignment averaged a whopping £1853!! Jersey Youngstock saw a steady trade with a super consignment from the Rivermead herd of the Davis Family of Tiverton selling served heifers to 1,100gns twice with their best calf topping at 1,900gns for a January born calf by Addiction with other calves to 1000gns & 800gns x 4. Another big entry met with much interest and those all important bulk buyers ensured another tidy and level trade without the strength of the previous weeks for headliner prices. That said a top of £72 was achieved by all the Ayre Family of Black Dog, Tom Dawe of Chillaton and Charlie Hutchings and Family of Bradninch who also sold the next best lambs at £48 & £42 with too many to mention then selling lambs at £38. Mediums normally £20 to £28 with lesser sorts back from that, Goat kids to £48, £39 & £33 twice from T & F Farming of Dawlish and the overall average was just about £26.

Store hogg numbers beginning to dry up as expected for mid April, as is the number of farmer buyers looking for them but trade for the forward sorts still very similar with only the smaller leaner farming hoggs being more difficult to place as they look like coming fit in the uncertain months of June & July. Top money of £140.50 going to Stephanie Vellacott of Greenham with a good pen of forward sorts, followed by Charlie Hutchings at £135, Trevor Crocker and Family of Diptford at £134.50 and John Gilbert of East Allington at £134. Mediums still all £100 plus but more bottom end sorts, many with faults sold on realization and pulling the average back to £109 overall.

Just over 100 grazing ewes with the goats saw Frances Brewer of Silverton reach £194, Charlie Hutchings had a Beltex at £190 and Messrs Wilson-North of South Molton parted with a Charollais ram at £188 and the best of the Goats made £108 for R Rowe of Newton Abbot.

Slightly more outfits forward at 215, included a smart run of purebred outfits from Margeret Heard of Maundown that dominated the top prices with her Charollais double rising to £405 and the best of her Texel, Beltex and Blue Texel singles running to £360, £330 and £320 three times. Other strong doubles to £350 for all Charlie Hutchings and Family, Ray Tucker of Bridford and Chris & Sue Popham of Trull closely followed by Geoff & Nicky Arscott of Chagford at £345 and Jim Winzer of Modbury at £335. Fred Chanin sold a pen of three ewes with five lambs well at £330 (£123.75/life) and plenty of other straight farming double couples either side of £100 per life. Majority of singles from £220 to £250 with better end sorts often pushing £300 and Michael Vooght of Hennock parted with an eye catching pen of flock aged Texel x Lleyn looking ewes with well grown single lambs at £312. More hill ewes with lambs forward again this week and more still expected for our next sale in a fortnights time, with those today trading from £34 to £79 per life and all included in the overall averages of £258 per outfit and £105 per life.

### Prime Cattle to 400ppk and £3069 Cull Cows & Bulls to 323ppk and £5850

As last week, a short entry of prime and cull cattle still saw some very creditable returns not least when Adrian and Bradley Bowden of Drewsteignton parted with two very smart finished cattle for 400ppk apiece, firstly with a sublime 656kg British Blonde steer which realised £2620 followed by a nicely covered 576kg Limousin heifer also at 400ppk and which drew £2301. Further finished steer prices of note included British Blue's selling to £2575 (684kg x 377ppk) for David Slade of Chagford and a huge 804kg aged (48m) Limousin bullock sold on behalf of Paul Bellamy (trading as South West Bobcat) which at 332ppk grossed £2665. Some outstanding cull cows about again this week with the very best returning a mighty £2490 (770kg x 324ppk) for an eye catching Limousin cross from Elle Slade from Aylesbeare whilst South Devon barreners levelled out at £2430 (828kg x 294ppk) and £2332 (892kg x 262ppk) for David Heath of Sherford and Vooght Brothers of Luton, Chudleigh respectively. A strong red Limousin cow from Brian Vallance and Family of Bickington realised an impressive £2309 (766kg x 302ppk) followed by a statuesque British Blonde barrener from Adrian and Bradley Bowden which topped out at £1880 (628kg  $\times$  300ppk) and the best of the Devon cows on offer at £1225 (608kg x 202ppk) for Anthony French of Ideford. Just the one cull bull on offer this week when a grand 1026kg Aberdeen Angus from Brian Vallance and Family fetched 252ppk or £2580.

#### WHAT A DAY!

A record number of sheep forward for the weekly prime market with 7132 forward and sold from 278 individual vendors from across the Westcountry, South Wales and all up the South coast selling to all major national firms. Prime sheep prices are under a bit of pressure nationally at present and although we thank all our farmers and hauliers for their patience on a busy day we didn't put anyone on a waiting list or turn anyone away.

#### 2193 PRIME SPRING LAMBS

A massive show of springers, drastically increased on the week included many good lambs forward for our

Easter show and sale. Judging this year was in the very capable hands of Mr Roger Heggadon, to whom we extend our thanks and who had to pick his way through twelve pairs of Continental sired lambs and ten pairs of natives to award the overall Championship to a pair of Texel cross 40kg lambs from Phillip and Peter Rowell of Crockernwell that went on to sell at £190 per head or a sale topping 475ppk to Darts Farm Butchers of Topsham. First prize natives came from the Retter Family of Cheriton Bishop and were 44kg Suffolk crosses and rose to £180 apiece to Dan Westmore, on behalf of AC Hopkins of Taunton. Second prize natives were 40kg Suffolk crosses from Jack Enticott and Family of Wellington that realised £166 and third prize went to heavier 53kg Suffolk lambs from Tom Yandle of Oxton that made £188, with Tom selling another pair of the same weight and breed at the same money. Second place continental lambs came from Michael Down and Family of Payhembury, weighing 41kgs, these Texel crosses made £169 and third prize went to Charollais lambs from John Barker and Family of Wellington that scaled 43kgs and attained £175. Other show lambs of note saw Andy O'Brien and Family of Whimple sell 50kgs at £188, Ben & Sarah Tuck of Honiton had 40kgs at £166 as Ross Baker and Family of Highampton sold plummy 39kg Beltex crosses at £165 and Deane Hurford of Axminster saw his 35kg Beltex crosses rise to £154 (440ppk). Away from the show and Jack Enticott and Family topped the sale again this week with overweights at £192, Tom Yandle claimed £184 and both the Blackmore Family of Feniton and John Kendall of Sturminster Newton achieved £180 of overweights. 52's to £180 again for Jack Enticott as Ellen Willis of Christow sold 49's at £182 and Robert & Edward Mortimer of Kenford had 47kgs at £175. 43kg

#### 2588 PRIME HOGGS & 255 MATURE SHEEP

We've come to expect and handle 2000 hoggs here at Exeter every Monday over the past few months but today's unprecedented entry took us closer to 3000 and although it was logistically challenging, we didn't turn anyone away and the full team of eleven buyers were present from the first to the last.

The hogg trade is typified today by the fact a pen of colossal 79kg Milk sheep cross mature sheep topped the market at £195 for the Baker Family of Kennford who had certainly grown them well from buying them from here more than 12 months ago in the orphan lamb pens, they were undoubtedly helped by the current sensational ewe trade. As were the over 60kg heavy hoggs with lambs teeth, these sold to a top of £189 for the Rowe Family of Bridgwater and Jonathan Strout of Callington with Oakfords Ken Chapple at £187 as Ross May and Family of Netherexe made £180 of theirs. The 50-52kg hoggs typically just under £3 per kilo with a super run of nearly 200 from John Quick of Taunton selling several pens over £3/kg with this weight from £157 to £159.50 and £159.50 also for a super pen of 49kg Beltex bred hoggs that topped the sale per kilo at 326ppk. Other 50's at £154 for Tom & Emma Wotton of Moretonhampstead, next best 49's at £149 for Messrs Mildon & Ley down from South Molton as 48's reached £146 for Mark & Anita Saunders of Hemyock and some smart 46's sold to £144 for Mark Harvey of Slapton, £141.50 for Roger Coysh of Sigford and £141 for Alf Lewis and Family of Cheriton Fitzpaine. £141 also the top for the 45kgs, this time achieved by Jonathan Mills of Totnes with Abel Bros of Tavistock waiting all day to see their 45kg Mules make £140 in the early evening. 44's to £135.50 for a double pen from Steve Locke of Jacobstowe as 43's sold to £133 for both the Norman Family of Cadbury and Ben Cullen of Exeter and a smart pen of 40kg hoggs realised £125 for Steve Browse and Family of Halberton. Lighter hoggs mainly consisting of hill bred sorts and the vast majority going for slaughter which is always encouraging for future prospects. 38kgs to £120 for Higher Cliston Farm of Sampford Courtenay as more of this weight sold at £116 for Rob Harding of Lympstone and 37's to £115 again for Steve Browse and Family. No les than six pens of either 35 or 36kg mainly Cheviot and Scotch hoggs selling at £108 and all either side of £3/kg provided they're meat.

A colossal number of mature sheep saw mid 60kg toothers make £175.50 & £168 for the Rowe Family, £174 for Mark Harvey and £172 & £166.50 for Jonathan Mills with the best per kilo going again to John Quick with 49kgs at £140 and 286ppk.

### **2008 CULL EWES, 78 RAMS & 10 GOATS**

Sensational from start to finish! Trade just as strong as last week but with more forward and many of which were lambing disasters and very much "the next draw down" after last week's complete flyer the average today was £7 less at £176 but in fact some sheep looked even dearer than seven days ago. The top 25 prices all over £270 to a top of £395 for a monster great Texel from the Quick Family of Crediton who sold the rest of the pen at £365 whilst Chris Ruby of Liskeard parted with six at £340 and Kevin & Becky Matthews of Launceston sold their best pair of Texel's at £335 closely followed by Louise Winsor of Beaworthy with single Texel at £330. Tom Nancekivell travelled up from Bude to top the Charollais with a single at £325 as Gerald Burrough of Honiton had other Charollais in pairs at £300 & £280 and more Texel's at £320 for Roger & Sarah Geake of Lamerton and £315 for Will Braund of Whitestone. Best Suffolk crosses very similar on the week and either side of £230 with heavy Dorset ewes something similar and pen after pen of these meat ewes top side of £200 with the leaner recently weaned Dorset ewes also looking every bit as dear and regularly £170 to £200. Mules to £195 for Ellen Yandle of Oxton with good Mules usually £170 to £185 and the next cut down £150 to £170. Hill ewes to £190 and £186 for Cheviots from the Jordan Family of Chagford who also sold Scotch ewes at £146 and the next draw down were often £115 to £135. Rams to £290 for a single from Chris Ruby as Jack Enticott sold penful's at £268 & £230, the Hansford Family of Ottery St Mary sold a pair at £265 and Matt and Adam care of Looe parted with a beloved Dorset Horn ram for £235. Lots of medium rams from £165 to £210, a pen of hard old Scotch rams made £125 for the Vallance Family of Bickington and the overall average for the boys was £156. A handful of goats peaked at £185 for T & F Farming of Dawlish.

Sincere thanks to all farmers from near and far for their support, those of you who helped move sheep during the day, all the hauliers and of course the wonderful team of staff. Everyone of us as important as each other to making Exeter the massive success it is each and every Monday.


