

Prime Cattle to 405ppk and £2638 Cull Cows to 345ppk and £2715

Several more through the prime cattle and cull cow ring here at Exeter on Monday with top per kilo for finished heifers reaching a very decent 405 pence given for a trim 568kg British Blonde from Adrian and Bradley Bowden of Drewsteignton which also realised £2297. Further well turned out Blonde females from the Bowden's reached £2463 (612kg x 403ppk) whilst well fed British Blues from Gordon Keep of Moretonhampstead came back at £2307 (642kg x 360ppk) and strong Aberdeen Angus saw £2294 (668kg x 344ppk) for R & P Faming of Mamhead. The latter also sold grand heavyweight Angus steers to £2598 (784kg x 332ppk) whist SM & MA Cole of Nomansland parted with their best Angus bullock for £2432 (662kg x 368ppk) and young mediumweight sorts of the same breed from Rosie Fishleigh of Sourton Cross returned £1995 (546kg x 366ppk). Also a neat Devon bred bullock in that weight range saw £1919 (534kg x 360ppk) for Adrian and Bradley Bowden. Back to the heavy steers where Bottor Rock Farms of Hennock parted with a shapely British Blue for £2263 (616kg x 368ppk) and a smart British Blonde drew £2220 (570kg x 390ppk) for Adrian and Bradley Bowden again. Also, a young (18m) Charolais bred steer realised £2064 (568kg \times 364ppk) for Rosie Fishley. Some very useful over thirty month prime on offer this week with Aberdeen Angus steers rising to £2638 (718kg x 368ppk) and £2313 (662kg x 350ppk) for Nick Parkinson of Burrington and Robert and William Reddaway from South Tawton respectively together with aged (53m) red Limousin heifers making £2161 (660kg x 328ppk) for Willie Sampson up from Chudleigh. British Blue heifers (33m) from Lawrence Squire of Swimbridge eased to £1898 (598kg x 318ppk). A big entry of cull cows was headed by a goliath of a South Devon from John and Andrew Ball of Stoke Gabriel when at 982kg she came back at 277ppk and a considerable £2715 with their next best still reaching £2078 (804kg x 259ppk). A well-built British Blue barrener from AJ Withers & Sons in from Cove easily racked up £2399 (788kg x 305ppk) followed by the better of a decent run of cows from Brian Vallance and Family of Bickington in the way of a young red Limousin which fetched £2308 (670kg x 345ppk). Cull bulls topped out at a decent enough £2317 (948kg x 245ppk) given for a ten year old Aberdeen Angus from Raymond and Sheila Palmer of Lustleigh.

A larger penning of 2357 Sheep comprised of 1555 prime lambs, 3 mature sheep, 765 cull ewes and 34 cull rams and wethers.

SQQ saw an improvement of 9 pence to level at 324ppk with an overall average of 313ppk (just two pence better) and £149 per head is unchanged on the week probably due to few more lighter hill and bottom end lambs on offer today. The 264 overweights sold averaged a couple of pounds more this week at £168 with numerous pens over £175 to tops of £185 for J & E Smith of Pennymoor and £180 for both Jim Forest of Dorset and Keith Rowell of Crockernwell whilst regular vendors Denis Jones and Family of Heasley Mill had two large pens at £178.50 as well as others at £178 and £176.50 twice. Top ppk in the overweights of 310ppk going to John Crooke of Sandford with 54's at

Amongst the heavyweights both 51 and 52kg lambs peaked at £159, with the 51's coming from John Crooke and Family and the 52's from Phil Lee of Tedburn St Mary as the best of the 50's jumped to £165 for a Beltex from Margaret Heard of Maundown with more at £159 for Richard Turner of Payhembury, £158.50 for Messrs Irwin and Sons of Mariansleigh and £158 for Frank Golledge of Dorchester. 49kg lambs to £155 for Ed Venning of Fowey as a smart 48kg lamb reached £160 for J & E Smith and a great line up of 46's sold to £154.50 for Julie Williams of Ilsington, £153 for Ben Lloyd of Crewkerne and £151.50 for both Ed Venning and David and Colin Smallacombe of Bow. Numerous other smart 46-47kg lambs trading at and around £150. 45's to £150 for both Rob Palmer of Winkleigh and CB Partners of Chevithorne and £149 for Tom Wotton and Family of Moretonhampstead as Jill Handley of Sampford Courtenay sold 44's at £148.50 and 43's at £145.50 both 338ppk. Two smart 42kg lambs from Josh Sibley of Beaminster topped the pence per kilo for the day when they made £147 and 350ppk with more 42's at £141 again for Julie Williams. Lighter weight lambs dearer again in line with the rising store trade with 39's to £129 for Mike Burley of Silverton, £128.50 for M Calcraft of Aylesbeare and £128 for Knights Care Farm of Fluxton. 37's to £125 and 33's to £107.50 and all keenly bid for amongst the large crowd of buyers.

A larger and more mixed show of ewes met the continuingly strong trade for all sizes, weights and grades. A larger show of tups now the selling season is over saw Andrew Hendy of Diptford sell a surplus Suffolk at £262, with similar from Russell and Alison Retter of Cotleigh at £252, Jack Enticott of Wellington sold three well at £242 and John Rowland and Family of Compton Dundon sold a big Romney at £215 and three various at £169. Jim Forrest with rare breed tups at £152 twice and Peregrine Aubrey of Slapton sold a pen of 9 Lleyns at £148. Tups levelled at £153. Best of the ewes to £238 for a single Texel from Scott Hamlin and Family of Rackenford as Mike Tozer had thick Texel ewes at £210, Mark Harvey's pen of continental bred ewes were £204 and Lee Whitrow and Family of Honiton sold a Beltex ewe at £194. Suffolk crosses to £220 for a monster from John Simmons of Poltimore who sold the rest of the pen at £193, Jack Enticott's best Suffolk x Mule made £198 and he also sold BFL's well at £190. Both Sue Veysey and Alan & Dave Weymouth of Salcombe with their best at £190 and plenty of other heavy crossbred ewes from £168 to £188. Mules lacking the quality and weight this week with the best selling into the mid £140's and plenty of half to three quarter meat sorts trading in the £130's. Hill ewes out in force with Tom Havill selling his Welsh type ewes to £110 and the Caunter Family of lpplepen with Scotch ewes at £104.
