### Store Steers to £2590 Store Heifers to £2460

Big numbers about in the store cattle pens again this week as you would expect at this time of the year, but as reported in our previous weeks, what you would not expect during October is seeing demand as strong as it is at present. Plenty of buyer power around the sale ring once again, both local and from further afield ensured prices were kept as high as we have seen them. Store steers topped out at a very creditable £1590 given for a trio of awesome black Limousins (26m) from Peter Hooper of Bovey Tracey whilst younger Limousin steers (18m) also of high calibre still drew a very worthy £2480 for Dan Gould of Taunton. Charolais bullocks up next when eye catching sorts from Nick and Margaret Lugger up from Modbury saw a pair (29m) reach £2570 apiece and a pen of three (21m) sell at £2500 each. Also, other Charolais steers to crack that £2000 barrier included tremendous ones (18m) from Barry Mildon and Family of Cadbury at £2440 followed four more of a similar age from Dan Gould at just a bid back when reaching £2430 a life and a pair (24m) from Alan Hembrow and Family up from Lostwithiel which ran to £2410. Dan Gould was also quickly back and selling more strong steers to £2470 for a sublime British Blonde (24m) and a gate rattling pen of six Simmental bred bullocks (20m) for a deserved £2370 apiece. Plenty of those well summered Aberdeen Angus steers about again this Friday which topped out at £2310 for Nick and Margaret Lugger with a pair of grand sorts (24m) followed by others born around the same time reaching £2290 for Rothamsted Research of Okehampton and a neat thirty month Angus bullock from Colin Wakeham of Buckfastleigh at £2280. Other native breed steers ran to £2290 for a pair of outstanding South Devons (19m) from Richard and Angela Smaridge from East Allington and £2170 (25m) from Dan Tooze up from Broadsands. Also, a young Beef Shorthorn steer (18m) from Dan Alford of Tavistock drew a very decent £1940. The better of a wonderful run of mainly Gascon crossbred cattle from Sam and Roger Chestnutt in from Thorndon Cross saw their very best steers (16m) rise to £2000. Nick and Margaret Lugger were back when topping the store heifer section with more of their fabulous Charolais cattle (28m) making £2460 followed by other well bred and farmed Charolais (18m) at £2380 for Barry Mildon and Family and £2250 (22m) from Alan Hembrow and Family again, who also parted from a solitary but shapely Aberdeen Angus female for £2200. Strong Limousin heifers (28m) eased to £2160 and £2100 for Andrew Peters and Family of Talaton and Alan Hembrow and Family respectively whilst Beef Shorthorns (14m) saw £1980 for Mary Alford of Tavistock and Angus heifers (24m) came back at £1970 for a smart trio from Martin Reed and family down from Kings Nympton. Best of the British Blue heifers saw a brisk trade when fetching £1950 (24m) for Graham Hawkins of Thorverton followed Andrew and Phillip Cooke in from Honiton with smart later born Blues (16m) which were not that far back at £1910. Just a handful of grazing cows about this week which saw at top of £1980 for a Limousin from Tony Francis of Okehampton followed by a British Blue from Geoff Arscott and Family in from Chagford at £1790 and a young Simmental cow from Russell Steer and Family of Ashburton which exceeded all expectation when selling for £1740.



Trade flying for all types forward with new purchasers sourcing good quality youngstock out of Exeter for the first time. Unprecedented prices and records being smashed with MJ & MW Bickle & Son of Bridestowe achieving £2140 for Limousin cross steers (IIm). Further Limousin steers off the same good farm attained £1980, £1920 & £1680 (IIm). Connor Pengelly of Cullompton presented a run of wonderful Limousin cross steers with the best topping out at £1900 (9m) with others realising £1680 & £1660 (8m). Best of the natives saw Richard Gray of Holne sell a penful of South Devon steers (12m) to £1830. A wonderful run of Charolais steers from Ian Balsdon of Hatherleigh topped out at £1820 (9m) with younger types (7m) to £1700 & £1640. Limousin cross steers from Rob & Sue Greep of Cornwood levelled out at £1780 (10m) with other pens to £1720 & £1710. Phil, Dawn & Tom Cleave of Holne sold two cracking pens of Charolais cross steers (11m) which achieved £1780 & £1760 (9m). MA Stephens of Plympton sold a useful Simmental cross steer (10m) to £1740 with further Charolais steers this time from Olly Stephens of Liskeard topping out at £1700 (7m) with others to £1670. M & JD White of Lewannick sold their Limousin cross steers (9m) to £1660 with others to £1600. A noteworthy mention for John Shears of Chagword, Ben Tristram of Wellington & AW & OS Mann and Partners of Widecombe in the Moor all topping out at £1500 for both Limousin crosses and Charolais cross steers (8m). In the heifer section, trade remained red hot with MJ & MW Bickle & Son topping out at £1750 for Limousin cross heifers (11m) with others to £1600 & £1460. M & JD White sold Limousin cross heifers (9m) to £1570 whilst lan Balsdon realised £1550, £1420 & £1340 for Charolais heifers (6/9m). Rob & Sue Greep sold pens of Limousin heifers (9m) which topped out at £1520 with others to £1380. Further Charolais heifers from AW & OS Mann & Partners levelled out at £1400 (11m) whilst Connor Pengelly sold Limousin cross heifers (9m) to £1400 with others to £1360. Young Charolais heifers from Olly Stephens topped out at £1280 (7m) with MA Stephens levelling out at £1200 for Simmental cross heifers (8m). Best of the natives saw Richard Gray achieve £1150 for South Devon heifers (IIm).





### **1482 STORE LAMBS**

A quieter day in the sheep pens after Tuesday's breeding sale with just shy of 1500 store lambs seeing a similar trade for the stronger more forward lambs whilst medium and longer term keeping lambs were back in the region of £5-£8 from last week's flyer with a lot of business for these done between £105 and £115. Top money in the stores going to AM Pulford of Meshaw with Dorset ewe lambs reaching £160 & £149 as JI Sturla of East Worlington reached £140, ATG Agricultural of Dorset claimed £139 and Edward Pring of Broadclyst had a penful at £138.50. Plenty of other forward lambs either side of £130 with well bred medium keep lambs normally all in the £120's. Another sizable percentage of hill lambs forward today with the best of them knocking on the door of £100 but plenty of smaller and harder done sorts back in the £40's, £50's and £60's. Overall average of £109 is up nearly £3 on the week, but in truth this was due mainly to the better quality on offer.

Grazers peaked at £200 for an unwarranted Texel tup from Edward Pring of Broadclyst with ewes reaching £162 for Roger Alford of Sourton and ATG Agricultural sold their best at £148, £125 & £110.


