#### Store Steers to £2570 Store Heifers to £2190

Fewer store cattle forward this week, maybe partly due to the flush of grass in all parts and a busy week on the land helped by the dryer conditions of late, although the lack of numbers certainly cannot be attributed to any sort of falling trade as we saw all types much dearer on the week and a packed ringside of buyers, both from away and nearer to home here at Exeter to eat them up. Generally, there was as good a quality of cattle on show as we have seen of late, some know doubt drawn by our second autumn show and sale of continental bred steers and heifers. Top price of the day came in the way of an outstanding run of British Blue steers (all around 25m)from Joel Sparks of Churchinford when we saw tremendous bunches rise to a considerable £2590, £2530 and £2490 followed by further solid looking strong Blues of a similar age drawing an impressive £2450 and £2350 for Al & JL Burrough of Wellington and Raymond Latham down from South Molton respectively. Plenty of other store steers selling way ahead of the £2000 mark, including an eye catching Limousin (28m) from Steve Parish of Chawleigh which saw £2450 whilst later born Limousin bred bullocks (18m) ran to a creditable £2060 for Stephen and Angela Dennis of Inwardleigh and £2020 paid for a super trio from Paul Giddy up from Downderry. Also, top notch Simmental bred steers (18m) comfortably ran to £2480 for Dave Pollard of Black Dog. Some delightful Charolais bred steers on offer this week too with the very best (24m) rising to £2400 for Raymond Latham again followed by younger Charolais (20m) making £2300 for Paul Pincombe of Lapford and later again born sorts (13m) at a decent £2240 for David Enticott and Family of Wellington. Grand Aberdeen Angus steers (24m) from Michael Tooze of Broadsands sold well and to £2210 as did a fine bunch of five younger (18m) Angus when reaching £2120 apiece for Scott Hamlin and Family of Templeton. The best of the Hereford steers (24m) saw £2110 for David and Adrian Cole of Bradninch and £1940 for Al Rogers from lyybridge. The store heifer section was headed by a superb, aged British Blue from Paul Giddy which ran to £2540 whilst a much younger (27m) blues returned £2350 apiece for a pair from AL & JL Burrough. Paul Giddy was soon back when parting with a couple of smart Limousin heifers (21m) for £2190 a life as was Dave Pollard with a pair of super Limousin females (18m) which came back at £2160 each. The latter also saw three first rate Simmental heifers (20m) make £2070 apiece. More well turned out heifers saw very tidy Charolais sell to a premium at £2090 (22m) for Roger Calcraft of Aylesbeare followed by a later born Charolais (13m) of some calibre for David Enticott and family which made £1860. Also, trim suckler bred Aberdeen Angus heifers (25m) from Alan lewell of Okehampton sold readily and for £1790.

A good entry of 130 Dairy cattle saw number of fresh milk sell to a decent trade for what was forward topping at £1950 for a fresh heifer from Folly Farm Dairy Ltd of Reading. Crossbred cows to £1450, £1400 & £1300 x2 for Prospect Farming of Dorchester. The first consignment of British Friesian cows from James Dunn of Camborne topped at £1520gns for a young second calver with in-calf heifers from the same farm topping at 1150gns and bulling heifers to 820gns. Organic crossbred bulling heifers to £810 & £790 for BA Pyne & Son of Budleigh Salterton.

The dispersal sale of 86 youngstock on behalf of Folly Farm Dairy Ltd of Reading sold to a flying trade with serious demand from start to finish. In-calf heifers sold to a top of 1950gns with others to 1750gns, 1700gns & 1650gns x2. Nine and ten month old yearling heifers sold exceptionally well topping at 1130gns x7 with other groups to 1120gns x7, 1110gns x 6 & 1020gns x3. Heifer Calves topped at 780gns with others to 730gns, 660gns x5, 550gns 4, 540gns x5 and the month old baby calves sold between 350-400gns.

#### 1968 STORE LAMBS

Just shy of 2000 store lambs to kick the sheep sales off were of another mixy show but included probably more bigger and better lambs than recent weeks. These were well received with numerous buyers on the forward and medium sorts whilst the staler, cold and plain lambs were harder to place. Best lambs to £158 for Messrs Adcock & Wotton with size and shape closely followed by Jonathan Musgrave and Family of Yealmpton at £157 whilst Colin Drake and Family of Dunsford sold Dorset ewe lambs at £154 & £150. Jon Andrews and Family of Wembury reached £149 of their best with Geoff & Nicky Arscott of Chagford at £145 and plenty of other short keep lambs from £120 to £140 with some medium keeps creeping into the £120's also. Longer term lambs a variable trade with plain and stale sorts that have lost their backs being a struggle to sell whilst better condition sorts were still regularly late £80's and in the £90's. Overall average of £107.86 is up £6 on the week.

#### **112 GRAZING EWES**

Less grazers forward with 112 sold today and trade dearer, some to the tune of £10 more on the week. D Laws of Dawlish peaked at £150 & £144 with Charollais types as Adcock & Wotton had more of the same at £145 and Jon Andrews and Family sold their best pen at £136. Plenty of other leaner grazing types from £90 to £130 and plainer hill ewes often £48 to £68 and all looking well sold.

#### 90 BREEDING EWES & 13 RAMS

A straight trade for the ewes on offer whilst ram trade was selective with the best of the breeding ewes to £162 for TL Knight of Sidmouth with FM Dorset x ewes followed closely by D Laws with Charollais type younger ewes at £158, Ian Rowe of Whidddon Down with older Texel x ewes at £152 and both Fred Janes of Moretonhampstead and the Andrews Family of Dulverton selling their best at £150. The Burrough family of Axminster sold four pens of flock aged Easycare ewes at £148 twice and £145 twice and Fiona Davies-Russel of Clayhidon sold FM Beulah's well at £130 and Herdwick 4T's at £115. Best of the rams to £300 for both Tony England of Tiverton and Norman Dalgarno of Truro who sold another at £290 as Geoff & Nicky Arscott sold an older Charollais ram at £280 as well as a smaller shearling at the same money.

#### 6 EWES & 8 LAMBS (14 LIVES)

Strong FM Dorset couples from Steve & Carol Simmons of Chittlehampton averaged just over the £100 per life with doubles peaking at £308 whilst the singles sold to £218, £205 & £200.
