## Livestock Notice to Purchasers

**Health & Safety** - Kivells accept no liability for any damage or injury to persons, livestock, vehicles or plant not arising out of their negligence. Any person entering the livestock market premises does so at their own risk and must comply with the requirements of any Health and Safety notices. All persons entering the livestock markets premises are hereby given notice that there are potential hazards due to the type, penning, herding, loading and unloading of livestock and vehicle movement. Caution should be exercised and children must be fully supervised at all times. Kivells reserve the right to refuse admission to any person or vehicle into the livestock market premises without giving reason. Kivells strongly advise that no persons access the sale ring, pennage or livestock passageways during the sale or whilst animals are being moved through passageways. Should any person decide to enter these aforementioned areas they do so entirely at their own risk. Any incidents or accidents in the livestock market premises should be reported to Kivells market office immediately.

**Biosecurity and Livestock Welfare** - All persons entering Kivells livestock market premises must comply with all current Biosecurity legislation, rules and conditions. All persons should be in clean clothing and disinfect footwear upon entry and exit from the livestock market premises. Hand wash facilities, disinfectant boot dips and brushes are available and should be used. 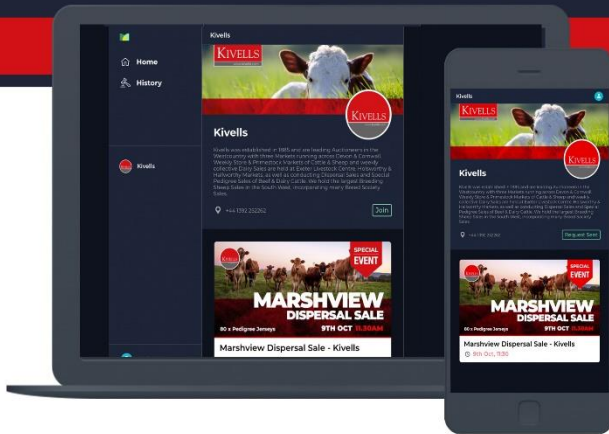

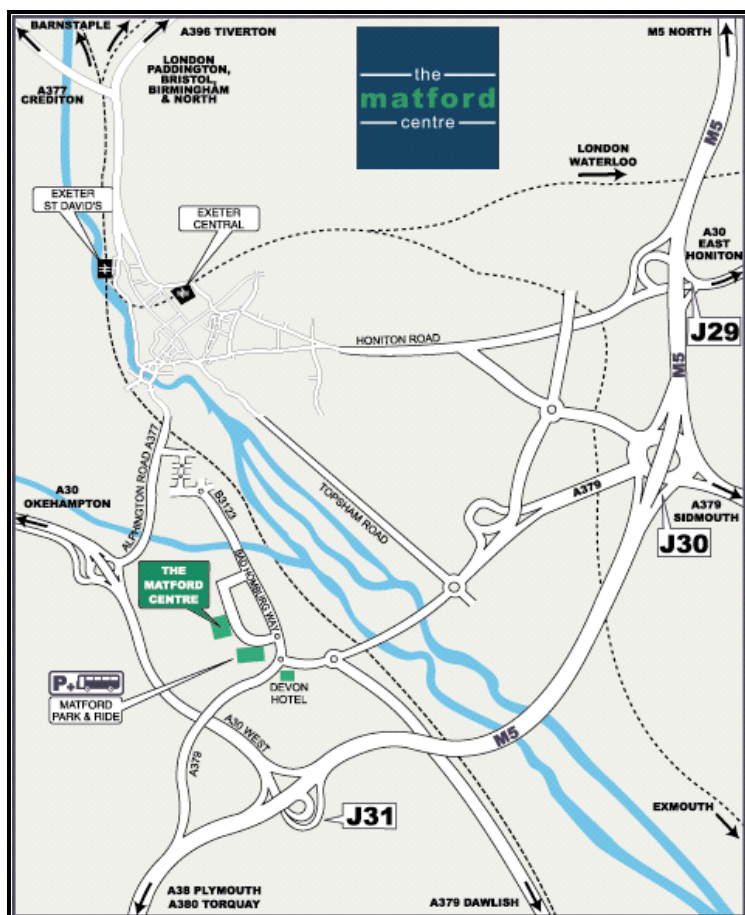

## CENTURION- A HISTORY (KEITH MAY) CENTURION TURNS 35



Centurion Dorset Breeders group was set up in 1991 when 10 forward thinking breeders (Cornella, Trevilly, Sherborne, Huish, Streetfield, Hinton, Langley, Armidale, Ashe & Blackhill), got together and agreed to provide a total of 100 ewes and form Centurion Flock K46. They were kept at Lackham College. The aim was to speed up the genetic improvement in the breed by using the best rams available. In the first year 93 ewes lambed, and in the first 5 years (1991/1995) a total of 652 lambs were produced, all were MLC Signet recorded. The best rams were kept for breeding.

In 1996 the Sire Reference Scheme was established, and a ram selection day was held each year at the home of Richard and Rob Hole's Sherborne flock. The top 2 rams then had semen collected to be distributed to the group. There was now no need for a separate Centurion flock as the improvements could be made directly into the members own flocks.

Eventually, the selection day was included at a market sale, firstly at Sedgemoor and then to Exeter. None of this would be possible without the help of Signet. We must acknowledge the recording work done by Maurice Jones, Rob Shields and Sam Boon. Over the years the recording system has grown from 6 week weights and lambing percentage to include back fat scanning at around 21 weeks, birth weights, mature weight and others to make a total of 15 Estimated Breeding Values. The latest advance coming in now being Genomics.

We have had many people who have made this possible, including chairmen, secretaries, recorders, scanners and most importantly members who have given their time to make it a success. Finally happy birthday to Huish and Blackhill, both still going strong with us after 35 years.

## HISTORY OF PERFORMANCE RECORDING SAMUEL BOON (AHDB)

The evolution of performance recording can be neatly shown in a single chart. Through the 70's and 80's individual flocks took part in MLC's ewe recording programmes. The schemes were low cost and high uptake, but with hindsight progress was limited. Neither the statistical procedures nor the computer power existed to tease out an animal's genetic potential from the records collected and farmers were provided with simple rankings of their animals that adjusted for the lambs being singles or twins, male or female.

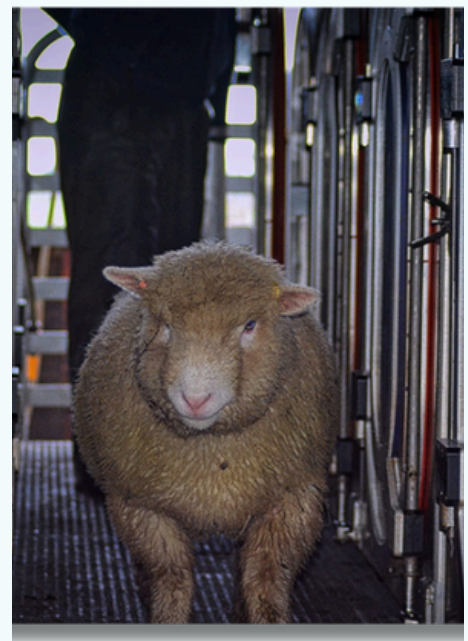
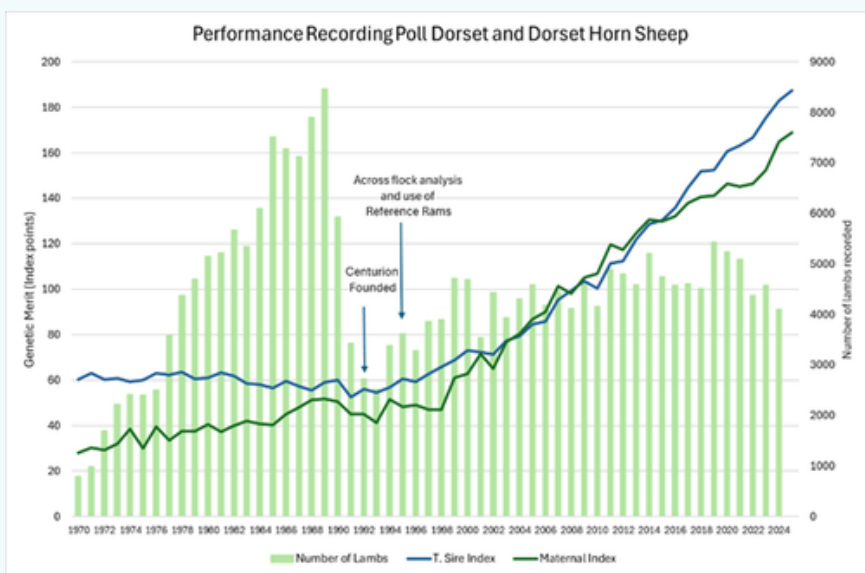
As flocks started to be charged to participate in performance recording, the less engaged breeders fell by the wayside while those seeking to drive genetic change in the breed remained as Signet clients.

The selection of reference rams (by Centurion members) whose semen was distributed by AI coincided with the arrival of the first across flock evaluations for the Dorset breed. Dorset ram buyers could at last find the best genetics from across the recorded population, rather than simply being able to identify the best sheep in individual flocks.

From the mid 90's genetic gain in maternal and terminal sire traits has increased and the breed has not looked back. The number of animals in the evaluation has been incredibly stable over the last 30 years at around 4,500 lambs per annum, with advances in EID, handling systems and farm software making it easier to collect data.

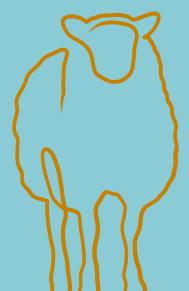
Today the breed sits at another important milestone, the introduction of the genomic technology that has led to major advances in the dairy and pig industries is now within the grasp of individual ram breeders. This technology will enhance breeding values for valuable maternal traits, like prolificacy and milk, for young unproven rams with an accuracy only previously obtained through extensive progeny testing.

Genomics is a new technology that will develop selection tools for the ram buyers of the future, but it has only been made possible due to the foundations laid by Signet Recorded Dorset flocks and the 50 years of weight recording that has proceeded it.

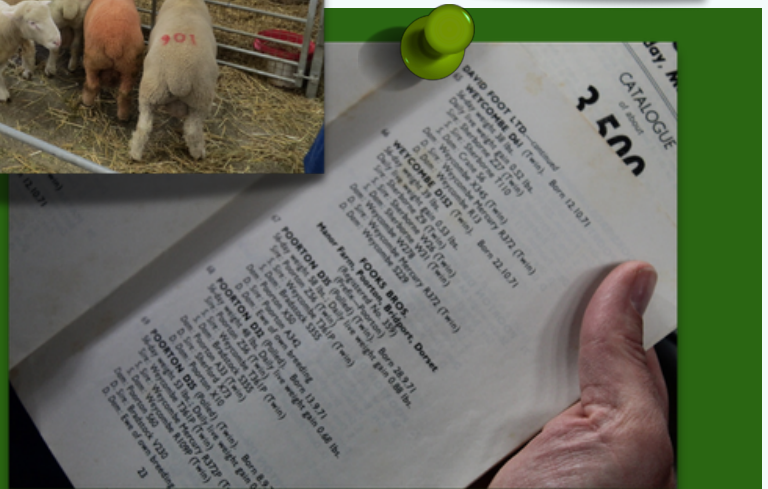

## FLOCK FOCUS- THE WOODBURN FLOCK (DAVID AND GEMMA RENDLE)

The Woodburn flock was founded in 2021 and was the result of a lifelong ambition to be sheep farmers. We just had to do 25 years as vets to be able to afford to do it! From the outset, we focused on ewe and ram performance to maximise the efficiency of the flock and therefore purchased foundation animals that were performance recorded. Our goal was to produce a highly efficient out of season breeding flock with optimal health and welfare status. We were very fortunate to find the Centurion group at the outset and have found being part of the group inspiring as well as informative.

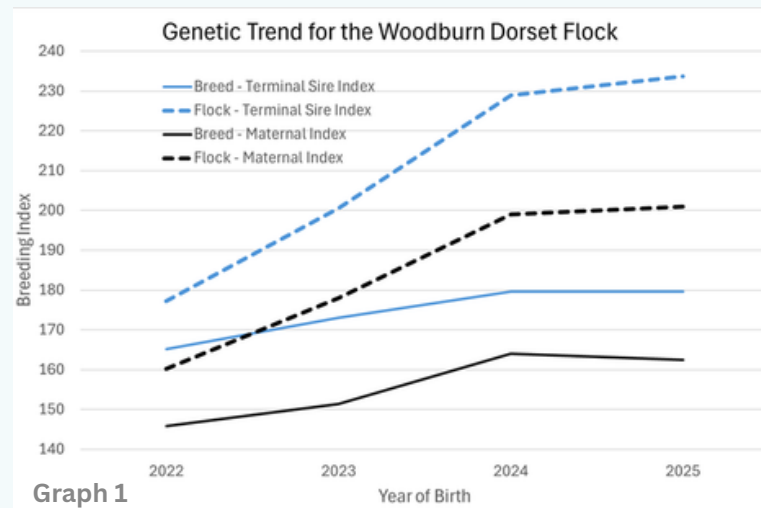
The flock was founded on 120 ewe lambs from the Sherborne flock, and a further 50 from a combination of the Blackhill and Prospect flocks. A few higher-index females were acquired at the Centurion sale, and then, when the highly regarded Gwenffrwd flock reduced in size, we worked with Tony and Laurel Brookin to integrate their highest-index sheep into the flock. We consider ourselves very fortunate as the rams we brought in from Gwenffrwd have exceeded all expectations. More recently, having gained a bit more confidence in our breeding decisions, we have invested heavily in high-index rams that will not only allow us to push our indexes upwards but will bring some additional length and size to our sheep.

Most recently and most notably, Huish Hyer and Paddock Leech Golden Hoof joined the flock, and their first (and very smart-looking!) lambs have just hit the ground. Our recent investment in different genetics also comes with a view to closing the flock to ensure we minimise the risk of introducing infectious disease, and we are looking at artificial insemination.

The investment in breeding is paying off with the type of sheep and the indexes we are achieving among our followers. We can do the maths (or ideally get Sam Boon to do it....) to translate increased lambing percentages and reduced days to slaughter to a monetary gain. The flock's average index has pushed upwards (Graph 1) and should jump again in a few months when we make some tough selection decisions and move on a lot of females of all ages to maintain the flock at around 250 ewes which seems right for our ground and buildings.

Selection decisions are made on estimated breeding values, physical characteristics and medical history and then which breed lines we need to focus on to maintain the right balance in the flock. Anything that is repeatedly treated or has a condition that we feel could recur is sent for slaughter. We use Border Software, which really helps in recording performance alongside the Signet database. We have configured our EID reader to display both maternal and terminal indexes so we can look at everything in the round – performance and type. Increasingly, we focus more on maternal than terminal characteristics. Ram selection is made by selecting the highest index animals and then eliminating any which have undesirable physical characteristics or simply don't look the part. Ewe lambs go through multiple rigorous rounds of selection based on figures, form and style. We are pleased to be able to offer some for sale.

Fat lambs are sold direct to slaughter on the Dalehead/Pilgrim's Dorset scheme or later in the year to ABP. This year lambs started to be drafted to go from 80- 90 days with the average days on farm for slaughter lambs being 113. With hindsight some of the first ones should have gone earlier as they came in over the 20 to 22kg carcass target. Most lambs grade U3L or R3L with some E3L and R3H. A focus for the flock moving forward is to try and reduce the average number of days to slaughter. Finishing lambs in December and January on high, exceptionally wet ground, is a challenge and reducing the need for feed at this time of year is seen as an important means of reducing our carbon footprint as well as our costs.

Ewe lambs receive less supplementary feed than ram lambs, however the majority are still expected to attain 55kg off a forage diet at 6-7 months, such that they are considered ready to be tupped. Moving forward, the intention is only to keep those ewe lambs which are ready to be tupped, such that there are no followers being kept from one year to the next. Whilst it does put pressure on young sheep, it reduces the pressure on grazing over the increasingly inclement winters and significantly reduces the overall flock inputs. It should also hasten selection for fast growing and finishing young stock.

Health is a key focus for what we are trying to achieve. It is cold, wet (and currently pretty miserable!) for a good chunk of the year where we farm, and this coincides with the greatest metabolic demand for ewes and lambs in an out of season breeding flock. We want to optimise performance and minimise lost production. Proactive vaccination against Clostridia/Pasturella, BTV, Footrot- all helps! We have active screening in place for infectious abortion, Border Disease, Johnes, CLA, liver fluke and are MV accredited.

Whilst we are focused on pushing our genetics forward and producing breeding animals, the flock has to be run on a commercial basis with sheep that can thrive under that management in a large flock, and we look to sell directly from the farm. Having resilient stock with a proven record of performance gives us confidence that the animals we sell for breeding will perform wherever they go.

I am really excited about the future of the flock and am always impatient to see the next generation. All our breeding animals are now genotyped, and we look forward to understanding how we can use this to accelerate improvement in the flock. The increasing interest from processors and supermarkets in recording efficiency and environmental impact can only add significance to the work we are doing, along with others in Centurion, to improve the breed. We will be venturing forth to some breed sales for the first time this year, which is intimidating, we know our offering is a bit different, but we have seen the benefit for our business and want to share our genetics with other like-minded flocks.

## WELCOME OUR NEWEST MEMBER

We now head to Canninton, Somerset to meet Angie Wills of the Currypool Flock and the newest member to the Centurion Group!

I set up my pedigree Poll Dorset flock in 2008 by purchasing 20 pedigree ewes and joined the Society in 2011. The flock gradually increased over the years to 250 ewes as I acquired grass keep. Last year I was offered 110 acres of herbal leys with the option to rent a further 90 acres this year.

I jumped at it as grass keep is a huge problem in the area. It also gave me the excuse to expand the flock to 430 ewes. Not wishing to go out and purchase more ewes to expand I decided to make the ewes work harder by lambing the main flock every 8 months and retaining my own ewe lambs which I have lambed as ewe lambs this winter. The ewe lambs will be retained again this winter to sell as breeding stock later in the year or next, while the finished lambs will continue to go on the Waitrose contract via Pilgrims which we have been a part of for the last 9 years.



I have been Signet recording since September 2024, initially to benchmark my flock with the breed average. This has proved very interesting as I have tried in the past to buy Signet recorded rams whenever the data is available. I find it a good tool to use the EBV's to evaluate the breeding traits I am looking for when purchasing rams that are going to be important in my flock's genetic makeup. It is important that as much data information should be used along with the visual and parentage when selecting new rams.

Signet recording is also helping when focusing on the ewe breeding stock with lambs growth and ewe maturity playing out as an important part of the selection for replacements. Many would not have heard of the Currypool flock as I do not show or sell rams due to time restrictions as I have a farm secretarial business as well which I try and juggle the two businesses alongside each other with just my "girl Friday" Hannah, helping once a week. My husband Nick has now joined the business and has taken a lot of the pressure off the juggling element. So I am hopeful that between us we can have more time to do the farming better and more efficiently.

I feel very privileged to be asked to join the Centurion Group as I have always considered the group to be at the top of the Dorset breeding tree and I know they all work hard to not only promote the breed but also move the breed forward genetically.

# Breeding for Sustainability for the Commercial Flock

Prospect Poll Dorsets has been performance recording their Poll Dorsets for seven years and latterly have been involved in the national Breed for CH4nge Innovate Research Project looking at reducing methane emissions from sheep through breeding choices. The flock is farmed predominantly on low input grassland on the Purbeck coast, along with their Stabiliser and Belted Galloway cattle and Hebridean Sheep. We will be looking at how they are approaching sustainable parasite control and how that has overlapped with the Breed for CH4nge project.

The farm walk will look at the impact of performance recording on the flock output and breeding values, how genomics is being introduced and why that might be relevant for commercial flock performance, and how this autumn lambing flock is managed.
