IMPOTANT INFORMATION – VETERINARY ATTESTATION

As of 13th December 2023 all Non Farm-Assured Vendors presenting any class of Prime or Cull Stock to market, will need to have a Veterinary Declaration to enable any products of animal origin to be exported to the EU. This attestation replaces the current farmer declaration that a holding has had "regular" vet visits. As of 13th December a Vet must visit a non-assured holding annually for the purpose of disease prevention & the detection of biosecurity risks, to enable any product from livestock to be exported. The visits can be combined with other visits covering routine work, provided that all species present at the premises are considered. Once completed by your vet you will be given a unique 20 digit Veterinary Attestation Number (VAN) made up of your Vets MRCVS number, your CPH number and the date of expiry. For example 1234567-10/100/1111-1024 (MRCVS) - (your CPH) - (valid until Oct 24) We have adapted our Market entry forms to reflect this change and hopefully identify VAN's easily.
